whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Hermann Temme

has been established and duly consummated in

conformity to law for the South East quarter of the South West quarter of Section twenty-three, in Township forty-four, of Range two East, in the district of lands subject to sale at Boonville, Missouri, containing forty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Hermann Temme the tract of Land above described: To Have and to Hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Hermann Temme and to his heirs and assigns forever:
