Whereas there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at Gainesville Florida, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of James A. Drawdy has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the north-west quarter of the north-east quarter and the south half of the north-east quarter of section two and the south-west quarter of the north-west quarter of section one in township eighteen south of range twenty-six east of Tallahassee Meridian in Florida, containing one hundred and fifty-nine acres and eighty-six hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said James A. Drawdy the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said James A. Drawdy and to his heirs and assigns forever.
