Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at Gainesville, Florida, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Mary Ann Drawdy, widow of William Drawdy deceased has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South East quarter, of the South West quarter, of section thirty-three, in Township twenty-one South, and the North East quarter, of the North West quarter of Section four, in Township twenty-two South, of Range thirty-one East, in the district of lands, subject to sale at Gainesville, Florida, containing seventy-seven acres, and eleven hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Mary Ann Drawdy the tract of Land above described: To Have and to Hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Mary Ann Drawdy and to her heirs and assigns forever:

In testimony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the CITY OF WASHINGTON, the thirtieth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and first.
