

George Francisco ^{Received a patent of which the following is a copy - 44 Nov: 1874 for George Francisco}
Thomas Jefferson, President of the United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE, That, in consideration of military service performed by *Thomas Burns and John Emmons* (both Soldiers for the War) - - - - -

to the United States, in the Virginia Line on Continental Establishment, and in pursuance of an Act of the Congress of the United States, passed on the 10th day of August in the year 1790, entitled "An Act to enable the Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Line on Continental Establishment to obtain titles to certain lands lying north-west of the River Ohio, between the little Miami and Sciota;" and - an other Act of the said Congress, - - - - - passed on the 9th day of June in the year 1794, - - - - - amendatory of the said Act, there is granted by the said United States unto *George Francisco,* - - - - -

a certain tract of land, containing *Four Hundred Acres* - - - - - situate between the little Miami and Sciota Rivers, north-west of the River Ohio, as by survey, bearing date the *Third* - - - - - day of *April* - - - - - in the year one thousand seven - hundred and ninety two and bounded and described as follows, TO WIT, *Surveyed for George Francisco Four hundred acres of land on two military warrants, to wit: On N^o 3771, for Two hundred acres in favor of the said Thomas Burns who assigned the same to the said George Francisco: And on N^o 3762 for two hundred acres in favor of the said John Emmons who assigned the same to the said George Francisco; On white Oak Creek, above Logans trace; Beginning at three Sugar Trees on the Bank of the Creek, opposite the first fork above the trace, running N75 W 200 poles to three Beeches, thence N15 E 320 poles crossing the Creek at two hundred and forty poles to an Ash and two Hickories, thence S75 E 200 poles to an Ash and two Sugar Trees, thence S15 W 320 poles crossing a Branch at sixty and the Creek at two hundred and eighty six poles to the Beginning;*

with the appurtenances: TO HAVE and TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances unto the said *George Francisco* - - - - - and *his* heirs and assigns forever.

IN WITNESS whereof, the said

Thomas Jefferson,

President of the United States of America, hath caused the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed, and signed the same with his hand, at the City of Washington, the *twentieth* - - - - - day of *October* - - - - - in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *four* - - - - - and of the Independence of the United States of America the twenty *twelfth*.
