Thomas Jefferson, President of the United States of America,

To all to whom thefe prefents fhall come, GREETING:

**K**NOW YE, That, in consideration of military service performed by Thomas Burns and John Emmons (both Soldiers for the War) - - -

a certain tract of land, containing Four Hundred Acres - - - - - situate between the little Miami and Sciota Rivers, north-west of the River Ohio, as by survey, bearing date the Third - - - day of April - - - in the year one thousand seven-hundred and ninety two and bounded and described as follows, TO WIT, Surveyed for George Francisco Four hundred Acres of land on two military warrants, to wit: On N<sup>o</sup>. 3971, for two hundred acres in favor of the said Thomas Burns who assigned the same to the said George Francisco; And on N<sup>o</sup>. 3762 for two hundred acres in favor of the said John Enmons who assigned the same to the said George Francisco; On white Oak Creek, above Logans trace; Beginning at three Sugar Trees on the Bank of the Creek, opposite the first fork above the trace, running N<sup>o</sup> 75 W 200 poles to three Beeches, thence N<sup>o</sup> 15 E 320 poles crossing the Creek at two hundred and forty poles to an Ash and two Hickories, thence S<sup>o</sup> 75 E 200 poles to an Ash and two Sugar Trees, thence S<sup>o</sup> 15 W 320 poles crossing a Branch at sixty and the Creek at two hundred and eighty six poles to the Beginning;

with the appurtenances : TO HAVE and TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances unto the said  
George Francis & — and his heirs and assigns forever.

President of the United States of America, hath caused the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed, and signed the same with his hand, at the City of Washington, the Ninth — — — day of October — — — in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four — — — and of the Independence of the United States of America the twenty Ninth:
